## A Message from the Executive Director

Dear Members, Partners and Friends,

AIA Pittsburgh is excited to share with you our 2020 Year in Review. 2020 was not all Zoom and doom, though there were days when it may have felt like it. It was a year that gave many of us a hard nudge to learn new things - from technology to terminology to ways of seeing and reflecting on our society and architects' role in it.

While the COVID-19 pandemic hindered some of our Chapter's plans for the year, it also presented new opportunities and identified ways that architects can make a difference in the face of the unexpected. Just one example is the Advocacy Committee exploring how architects could put their skills to use converting spaces for a COVID-19 care surge. The Chapter hosted four Town Halls and two Legal & HR Roundtables as forums to share information and learn from industry experts as everyone tried to adjust to a new normal. The pandemic further brought to light inequities in our communities, workplaces and homes, and spurred important discussions and action steps in our many of our committees. As part of this AIA and ULI hosted our first joint program, Built by Women, and our Equity Diversity and Inclusion group started researching and analyzing member demographics to better understand our community and its needs. We are still too close to 2020 to fully understand how it will change how we think, work, and live with each other, but already we are seeing new spaces designed with health and inclusiveness top of mind.

One of the greatest takeaways of the year is how valuable it is to be part of a community that remains resilient in the face of crisis. Members shared experiences and ideas across firms, local and state Chapters worked together even more to provide opportunities and resources for our members, and we collaborated with our partners to tackle shared challenges. Another great takeaway is that we simply missed seeing each other and the little joys of shared experiences.

YAF organizes a number of Building Tours, ARE Review Series, and cross-disciplinary events and opportunities throughout the year.



# **Pittsburgh Architecture Foundation**

Our mission is to advance architects' meaningful and collaborative involvement throughout the Pittsburgh region: fostering civic activism and leadership, sustainability, and the well-being of our communities.

## THE PITTSBURGH ARCHITECTURE FOUNDATION FOCUSES ON THREE MAIN POINTS:

## The Leadership Institute

Since 2016 this leadership program, developed for our Chapter's young and mid-career architects, has celebrated 79 graduates and the motivational influence they bring to the architecture and engineering professions. Due to COVID-19 restrictions there was no 2020 class. however classes are expected to resume in 2021.

#### **Public Outreach**

AIA Pittsburgh is convening an important conversation - how the built environment affects the health and wellbeing of our region. Our Blueprint for Better initiative received a \$11,000 grant from the Staunton Farm Foundation to further our work in 2020.

### **Community Engagement**

The Façade Renovation Program, begun in 2019, helps small, locally owned business in under-served communities re-envision their storefronts. The community-based work was put on hold for 2020 and program volunteers focused on developing a ToolKit for the program. The Program and its AIA Pittsburgh volunteers were featured in the national AIA magazine, YAF Connection.







#### **Leadership Pipeline**

PAF and the Chapter jointly supported two scholarships for members to attend the 10week National Intercultural Leadership Training program developed by AIA Minnesota.

## **Advocacy Committee**

Identifies, explores and advocates for issues that impact architects and the built environment in western PA. The group provides outreach to and discussions with local legislators, decision-makers and partners. Highlights of committee accomplishments in 2020 include:

- Established quarterly meetings with the new Director of the Dept. of Permits, Licensing and Inspections (PLI)
- Began developing a 2-year local advocacy platform for the Chapter

#### **AIA-MBA Joint Committee**

Promotes collaboration between the design and construction industries and supports cooperation and learning between the two groups. In 2020:

- Published a paper and brochure for First-Time Building Owners
- Created a task force to identify and address issues and best practices with PLI.

## Blueprint for Better

Builds on recent and developing research in neuroscience, sociology and psychology about how space impacts human wellbeing and how people perceive space. The initiative promotes architecture as a foundational element in what kind of city/region we are and for whom.

 Presented a session at Build Pittsburgh and received an \$11,000 grant to continue its work in 2021.

## Committee on the Environment (COTE)

Serves as the community and voice on behalf of AIA Pittsburgh architects regarding sustainable and resilient design. The group advances design practices that enhance a building's quality and performance, and promote human wellbeing. In 2020:

- Held 3 seminars and established 3 sub-committees: Education; Tall Timber; Deconstruction & Reuse
- Began planning a 2021 Seminar Series on the Framework for Design Excellence.

## **Design Pittsburgh Committee**

Plans and executes AIA Pittsburgh's signature program, Design Pittsburgh, which includes the Design Awards competition, exhibition and celebration. The committee seeks to engage the public in the value of good design in our communities. In 2020, the group helped shape a highy successful event with:

- 52 projects from 22 firms
- 1000+ virtual attendees
- 3 Social Impact Awards
- A Design Awards jury from AIA Baltimore

## Design Research + Practice Group

Infuses research into the practice of architecture in Pittsburgh and beyond and openly shares emerging data and knowledge with our community. The group hosts a lunch + learn format, speakers and online resources.

#### **Education Committee**

- Held Procrastinator's Day with 10 CEU sessions in December

## Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Committee

Explores and fosters diversity, equity and inclusion issues in the architecture profession in our region. In 2020:

- Collected and analyzed member/ PA architect statistics to better understand our community.
- Shared resources.

## Healthcare Committee / AIA Academy of Architecture for Health (new)

Shares knowledge and collaborates to improve health design education, connect to health design resources, strengthen the pipeline of architects for health/ wellness design, and provides advice to the wider community. In 2020:

## **Advocating for Architects**

AIA Pennsylvania hosted the second Architects Tele-Action Day. In one day, AIA Pennsylvania members and AIAS students, including many from Pittsburgh, met virtually with legislators. They advocated for issues and policies that impact the built environment and architects, and shared policy briefs and educational materials with over 200 state representatives and senators. Members discussed the Statute of Repose, Anti-Indemnification, and High Performance Buildings.



#### **HOW TO TELE-ADVOCATE Identify Your Legislators & Do Some Research** Find your legislator's information by inputting your home address in the "Find Your Legislator" feature. Once you have inputted your home address, click on the linked name of your PA House and PA Senate legislators to locate their district office phone number on their profile pages' left column. Take to google, Legis, a site dedicated to all things concerning PA's General Assembly, or your Legislators' official webpages to familiarize yourself with their backgrounds. Can you draw any personal or professional associations/shared experiences from their backgrounds? Use any anecdotes to strike up the conversation, build rapport, and emphasize any local community connections. Pick Up the Phone & Make Your Calls Call your State Senator and Representative's district office between the hours of 9 am - 5pm on Tuesday, March 23rd. **Introduce Yourself to the Office Gatekeepers** Introduce yourself and explain your relationship to the Senator or Representative. If you have an established relationship with your Senator or Representative, play that card. If not, no worries! Getting acquainted with constituents is part of legislators' day-to-day obligation as your elected official. Introduce yourself as a constituent and mention you are a member of AIA Pennsylvania, representing nearly 3,000 architecture industry professionals across Pennsylvania. Proceed to be transferred to your legislator or their staff or schedule a time to do so at a later date. Make a point to thank the office gatekeeper for their time and coordination Read on for a sample script.










# **Annual Meeting Celebrates our Community in 2020**
